This workshop for nonprofits and individuals will be held on Tuesday, May 25th, 9:15 a.m. - noon in the Hubbard Room at Russell Library, 123 Broad Street, Middletown. The first part of the program will be a "live feed" presented by David Holmes, the Regional Training Coordinator of the Foundation Center in Cleveland, Ohio. Mr. Holmes will provide an introduction to one of the key online tools for finding funders, Foundation Directory Online Professional. Learn how to create customized searches to develop lists of prospective foundation and corporate donors that will match your nonprofit organization's funding needs. David's presentation will be in webinar format but with a feed that will allow for an interactive question and answer period.

The second part of the workshop is "Proposal Writing, Tips for Success," presented by Ann Faust, President of Community Consulting, Inc. of Haddam. She will include updates and information to reflect the current times and trends for obtaining grants. Ms. Faust brings a solid background and knowledge of the Middletown area that is invaluable to grant seekers.

Refreshments and handouts will be available. The Russell Library is a Cooperating Collection Center for the Foundation Center, and a tour of these resources will be available as time permits.
